A/R: Still waiting for payments from Taco Bell and Group 1 Automotive. City of ABQ, City of Santa Fe, and US Eagle FCU pledges have cleared.

FY2027: JA USA will change the fee structure from a scaled fee to flat-rate fee and fee for services. They are also moving away from taxing 11.5% on gross revenue from special events.

Question: Is it a tiered tax structure?

• The previous tax structure was tiered based on each JA Area's revenue. We're still unsure at this time of exactly how much we'll pay.

JA USA also wants to see consolidations of smaller, city-based areas.

Overall, funds look healthy.

First committee meeting for the 2025-2026 School Year took place on September 16th.

Current Projections on September 16th: 5,077

Launched 3 new programs this Fall 2025 Semester:

- (1) JA Titan. Students become presents of a cell phone company. Students must tackle the challenges of running a business. Low-volunteer requirements.
- o There's a competition at the end, a volunteer can come in and provide feedback to the teams.]
- Program Team has approached Explora to utilize the makerspace for teams build prototypes of their cell phones
- o JA Titan is utilized as a fundraising event in other JA areas
- JA Titan also has a national competition through JA USA that we could participate in once the program is more established
- (2) JA It's My Job, Soft Skills Program
 Resume-Building, Workplace Etiquette, Prepping for Interviews, etc.
 Self-paced, 6th to 12th grade
- (3) JA It's My Journey, out-of-school-time elementary program Great for our partnership with Boys and Girls Clubs, goes as low as Pre-K

JA of NM Program Team has received a large number of requests to table at Career Fairs. Program Team is carefully selecting participating in Career Fairs that best align with our mission and capacity.

Career Speaker Series has already started, kicking off at East Mountain High School

- Jordana creates a promo video for schools and educators to promote the upcoming Career Speaker presentation.
- The Program Team welcomes any suggestions or connections for Career Speakers in the identified industries.

Changes in programmatic strategy from JA USA

- JA of NM is looking to stack programs and build Les for students. Paying attention to feeder schools.
- Example of stacking programs: If a teacher requests personal finance, also recommend Career Speaker presentation.

Program Committee will meet in person at Tula's for the first time in November.

We're expecting a growth in students served and growth in programs, despite having a decline in staffing.

Program Team also evaluated programs that aren't serving us well and decided to pause JA Inspire.
